Admission to the Certificate in Piano Pedagogy Program requires an entry audition. For graduate students, this audition must be at the level of a sophomore performance major.

Special Requirements for piano performance majors completing the Certificate in Piano Pedagogy:

- 1) Applied piano and recital requirements are not applicable to piano performance majors.
- 2) The research project will be in addition to any required coursework to meet other degree requirements.
- 3) Four credits of elective courses beyond those already taken for the degree will be required for the piano major. Courses such as organ, harpsichord, duo piano, Behavior Modification, other keyboard literature courses, MUS 3934 (Special Topics in Music), Writing for Musicians, or a DIS on a topic developed in consultation with program director and/or piano faculty are appropriate electives.

Special requirements for non - performance majors:

A recital program 30 minutes in length will be required, with performance level that of a junior piano major or senior piano principal. The program may be in the form of a studio recital or may be performed for a faculty committee.
